



Joint Pool Policy on Bloodborne Pathogen Exposure Control Plan

The plan should contain at a minimum the following elements:

- A procedure for the evaluation of circumstances surrounding exposure incidents;
- A list of job classifications for employees having an occupational exposure to Bloodborne pathogens;
- A list of tasks and situations in which occupational exposure is likely to occur;
- Engineering and work practice controls used to eliminate or minimize exposure;
- Methods of compliance, i.e. preventative measures, personal protective equipment, laundering clothing, resuscitation equipment, needles and sharps, properly disposing of contaminated evidence, housekeeping, vaccines/vaccinations, post-exposure evaluation and follow-up, employee training, and recordkeeping.

Effective January 1, 2016 this is a stand-alone policy and changes to the policy do not need to be reviewed or approved by the Pool Boards of Directors.
