The opioid crisis has become the worst drug epidemic in modern American history with

47,600 deaths involving an opioid in 2017. There were 2,470 deaths in NM due to drug overdose from 2013 to 2017.

North Carolina officials are hoping a new app, **Pokket**, will put a dent in the rate of recidivism by integrating it into the prison system's new re-entry program for Inmates. Prisoners would be introduced to the app which helps them plan out their return to their communities—six months before their release date. They would keep using it for six months to a year after that. One problem: Prisoners must have a phone or tablet before/after release.
