

- ⇒ Film 30-second videos with local constituents and post on social media (set up a photo booth)
- ⇒ Use hashtags: #iCountNM #2020CensusNM #USCensus2020 #nmcounties33 when posting
- ⇒ Create PSAs on local radio stations (some may give you free air time)
- \Rightarrow Create memes
- ⇒ 8-second pitch "This date, time, with these people, stop by" or how significant and important it is to be counted
- ⇒ Partner with libraries to set up Census kiosk with a dedicated computer, flyers, stickers, etc.
- ⇒ Demonstrate how to fill out the 2020 Census form
- ⇒ Use your community trusted messengers (elected officials, peers, etc.) to help kickoff your event
- Target local events or gathering places restaurants, breweries, grocery stores, churches, senior centers, health centers, rodeos, school games, etc.
- ⇒ Census bingo night

Voting Problems Open the Door to Election Alternatives

The voting meltdown in Iowa has increased mistrust in the traditional American election system. Support is growing for new ways to cast ballots, including ranked choice and approval voting.

- Ranked choice voting is a form of instant-runoff voting where voters express a preference not only for a first choice, but other candidates they support
- Maine was the first state to use RCV, in 2018
- Nevada used RCV on February 22, 2020
- RCV winner will have gotten support from majority of voters, even if not everyone's first choice
- RCV seems to cut down on negative campaigning with some candidates forming alliances with
- Approval voting is simple, easy to understand, easy to tabulate
- Under AP, people can support multiple candidates
- Under AP, the highest total would win

How Social Media is Elevating Engagement for Local Government

It's being used in increasingly powerful ways to enhance communications in hundreds of communities, helping to create trust, facilitate transparency, address residents' concerns, and solve problems. Social media has become for many the standard currency of government communication.

Agencies can showcase what makes government tick humans—by providing their communities with something identifiable and personalized: something fun or a sobering experience such as the aftermath of a natural disaster that evokes raw emotion.

Social media has evolved into an expected method of communication for residents, media, and other audiences elevating their connectivity to their local government. The challenge is to take it even further. ~Governing.com

Purpose: Provides funding to law enforcement agencies to hire and/or rehire career law enforcement officers in an effort to increase their community policing capacity and crime prevention efforts.

Eligible Applicants: State, local, and tribal law enforcement agencies.

Funding Information: \$400,000,000 in total funds, 500 awards expected. Deadline: March 11th, 2020

Purpose: Supports the safety of the public and firefighters by funding the purchase of equipment and relevant training.

Eligible Applicants: Fire departments, nonaffiliated EMS organizations, and state fire training academies. **Funding Information**: \$310,500,000 in total funds, 2500 awards expected. **Deadline: March 13th, 2020**
