High Interest Payday Loan Lenders Target Vulnerable Communities During COVID-19 Payday loan lenders are aggressively targeting vulnerable communities through online advertising because that's what they have done best since the 2009 financial crisis. These lenders often let people borrow money without confirming whether the borrower can pay it back. Research shows a typical payday borrower in the U.S. is trapped into 10 loans per year. This debt trap can lead to bankruptcy, that leads to reborrowing, that leads to damaged credit.

House Judiciary Committee to mark-up police reform legislation

The bill would make sweeping changes to administration and enforcement standards of local law enforcement agencies, including mandating the use of body-worn cameras, updating reporting requirements for use of force and officer misconduct, creating uniform accreditation standards across agencies and implementing policies and procedures that prohibit and combat racial profiling.
