

News Brief August 20, 2020

General Election 2020, Absentee Ballots, and More Ten counties signed up to send absentee application mailers to registered voters: Bernalillo, Colfax, Doña Ana, Grant, Guadalupe, Los Alamos, San Miguel, Sandoval, Santa Fe, and Valencia Counties. Since New Mexico is a member of ERIC, Electronic Registration Information Center, the SOS can also target Eligible but Unregistered (EBU) voters. Voter registration and updates can be done online (by October 6, 2020) or by mail (postmarked by October 6, 2020); or to register in person to vote by October 31, 2020. The SOS office provides a voter education outreach program that includes help with voter registration, poll worker recruitment, voting options, deadlines, and addresses USPS concerns. National Poll Worker Recruitment Day is September 1 and National Voter Registration Day is September 22.

There will be two constitutional amendments on the general election ballot: 1) proposal to reform the PRC and 2) proposal to standardize the date a non-statewide elected officer begins to serve. For more election information, please visit the Voting and Elections portal at **<u>nmvote.org</u>**.



General Election Timeline

Sept. 14 County clerk's offices can mail absentee ballot applications OR

Absentee ballots may be requested online


at **<u>nmvote.org</u>** (goes live **September 1**) or by contacting your county clerk's office

- Oct. 6 Absentee voting begins (ballots mailed from the county clerk's office from requests only)
- Oct. 17 In person early voting begins
- Oct. 20 Deadline to request an absentee ballot; received by 5 p.m.
- Oct. 31 Last day of early voting
- Nov. 3 Election Day 7 a.m. 7 p.m.
- Absentee ballots may be hand delivered to the county clerk's office or polling places as of Oct. 6
- Absentee ballots can also be returned by mail but must be received by Nov. 3, 7 p.m.

To drop off an absentee ballot, must be the registered voter, an immediate family member for that voter, or caretaker for that voter.
