
Last Call for 2020 Census Response! It's critical for your community members to selfrespond to the 2020 Census. The 2020 Census is set to end on **September 30**, which gives us **six** days to count everyone. Every New Mexican deserves to be counted. If New Mexicans aren't counted, it will cost our communities hundreds of millions of dollars in funding we need and deserve over the next decade. Let's break the numbers down:

- So far, **57.5%** of New Mexican households have responded and another **35.5%** have been counted by census takers for a total of **93.0%** (National average is **96.2%**)
- New Mexico receives over **\$7 billion** each year through federal programs
- If New Mexico undercounts residents by only 1%, we would lose \$780 million

The funding benefits our schools, affordable housing, health system and emergency services, senior centers, highways, jobs, and more. It also determines our political representation for the next 10 years. Let's drive this over the finish line and win the gold for New Mexicans!
