<u>Legislative Analysis for Counties:</u> <u>American Rescue Plan Act of 2021</u>

The bill heads to the Senate floor. The Majority in both houses aim to complete this process by March 14, when existing unemployment insurance provisions expire. New Mexico counties have a potential of over \$400M in allocations.

Census Bureau announces release of redistricting data to be delayed until Sept. 2021

Local governments will be faced with a shorter timeline to finish drawing new maps in time for the 2022 elections.

Legislative initiatives supporting lasting job growth

Signed by the Governor

HB11 – LEDA Changes – The temporary measure delivers \$200 million in new grants from the state's LEDA fund for rent, lease, or mortgage assistance to pandemic-impacted businesses, including restaurants and small retailers. The maximum grant is \$100,000 with businesses that saw the largest revenue decline prioritized first. Businesses receiving the funds are required to rehire or add new employees.

SB1 – Restaurant Gross Receipts Tax
Deduction – Provides immediate economic
relief in the form of a personal income tax
rebate of \$600 to families and individuals
claiming the Working Families Tax Credit, a
wage of about \$15 an hour (\$31,200 for single
filers, \$39,000 for families), by authorizing
\$105 million in state rebates from the
personal income tax.

SB3 - The Small Business Recovery and Stimulus Act - Makes up to \$500 million available to extend the Small Business Recovery Loan Fund created by the Legislature last year. New provisions would expand eligibility and provide terms that are more attractive for borrowers.
