


News Brief April 22, 2021

Maturity Model Certification (CMMC) Training. CMMC accreditation is a new unified standard for implementing cybersecurity practices across the defense industrial base. By September 30, 2025, all DOD contractors and subcontractors will be required to have certification. U.S. Treasury Releases New Guidance on Certification Process for State and Local Fiscal Recovery Fund

The U.S. Treasury released its guidance on pre <u>-award requirements</u>, outlining immediate steps counties need to take to receive direct payments from the U.S. Treasury under the Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Funds authorized by the American Rescue Plan Act.

Immediate Steps Counties Need to Take

to receive direct payments from the U.S. Treasury under the Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Funds:

- 1. Ensure the entity has a valid **DUNS** number
- 2. Ensure the entity has an active **SAM** registration
- 3. Gather: EIN, name, contact; Name/title of authorized county representative; Financial institution routing & account number, name, and contact information
