NACo Releases Cyber Security Priorities and Best Practices for

Counties NACo's new publication highlights the importance of cyber security and can serve as a resource for counties working toward strengthening cyber defenses. Recent cyberattacks, through email or cloud, are raising the security bar for what counties need to implement for cyber security.

- Funding assistance is a top priority to adequately provide security
- Multi-factor authentication significantly decreases successful cyber attacks on a county
 The .Gov domain administration has moved from the GSA to CISA; the benefit of switching
- to .gov over a .us, .com, or .org is that it raises the security; 30% of counties use .gov domain
- A need for monitoring tools, certified third party providers, IT assessments, end user protection
- Hiring a full-time security resource can cost a county easily \$100,000
- Consider a county membership with the Multi-State Information Sharing and Analysis Center; initial membership is no-cost with additional services for cost; a valuable security resource
- Imperative to have a stand-alone policy that at a minimum covers roles and responsibilities

Experts Talk Future of Cybersecurity, Near-Term Challenges

As cyber attacks rise, state and federal cybersecurity leaders have concerns about what it takes to effectively elevate their defenses and how the federal government can meaningfully support such work. Malicious attacks have become both more frequent and more complex, prompting the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency to issue nearly as many cybersecurity emergency directives during the first half of fiscal year 2021 as it did during the prior five years combined.

- Funding programs may have different stipulations attached; some grants are only available with matching contributions; some funding only made available for tightly defined uses
- Cybersecurity standards not a one-size-fitsall; local governments encouraged to follow Center for Internet Security's (CIS) controls
- Artificial intelligence can analyze and identify what is normal expected behavior and filter for potential threats
- Cloud-based agencies must have security staff who understand code and recognize when something is amiss. ~Govtech.com

USDA Seeks Applications for Placemaking Grants to Spur Economic Growth/Community Development in Rural America

\$3 million in cooperative agreement grants used for broadband access; preserve cultural and historical structures; support transportation, housing, recreational spaces.

USDA Grants to Help Repair Housing in Rural

Communities Housing repairs for low– and very–low–income rural residents with 20,000 or fewer people; Paper pre– applications due by July 7, 2021 or e-applications due by July 19, 2021; Will award a total of \$15 million.
