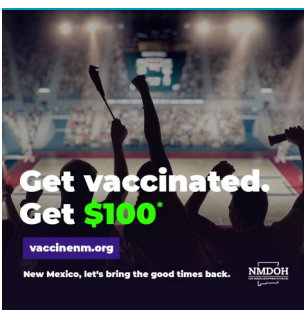
Amended rules on ARP spending

NACo strongly suggests counties submit comments for the record in response to Treasury’s Interim Final Rule on the Fiscal Recovery Fund to ensure the county voice is reflected in the public comments when it comes time to finalize the rule. The deadline to submit comments is **July 16, 2021**.

Good Times are Coming Back

New Mexico!!! Get vaccinated to bring the good times back and get \$100*! NM needs help from counties to reach its 60% vaccination goal, to reopen by July 1, by June 17. If

you have not yet received your COVID-19 vaccine, you can complete the vaccine in one shot with the Johnson & Johnson COVID-19 vaccine or get your booster shot if you still have not received it. Vax to the Max Sweepstakes

All New Mexicans who have received at least one shot are also eligible for the Vax 2 the Max sweepstakes, including a total of \$10 million in cash prizes and other awards. On June 18, New Mexico will conduct its first drawings – four prizes of \$250,000 each. New Mexicans who have completed their vaccination series will be eligible for the grand prize drawing of \$5 million in early August.

A reality-based simulation that prepares county risk leaders for cyberattacks by assessing counties' current state of readiness and identifying gaps. This simulation will help attendees evaluate their incident response procedures and tools and guide them in developing a detailed cyberattack response strategy.

Who Should Participate? Designed for cybersecurity managers, their teams, including HR, policy management, finance, public safety, and emergency services.
