Government is hiring, but HR professionals face competition from the private sector, accelerating retirement rates, fighting employee burnout, and a shortage of applicants for public safety, health care, engineering and IT jobs. Fall Tax Billing to be Delayed

NM county property owners will receive their fall tax bills a little late this year. The entities that rely on the disbursements of the tax funds will see a delay in their disbursements. This affects 16 counties in 2021. And why is that?

A change in state election laws created by the passage and signing of House Bill 407 in April 2019 enables public school districts to have bond issues on local election ballots and to have the increased tax rates take effect the same tax year if voters approve the bond issue. But results of the 2021 local elections will not be know until voting day on Nov. 2 at the earliest and will not be certified officially, given that school districts may be a multi-county jurisdiction, until NM Secretary of State conducts its canvass of election results on Nov. 23. Due to the new state law, tax bills will be sent out on Dec. 1 due by Dec. 10 and delinquent by Jan. 10.
