



**NACo: Treasury releases new information on how counties can access second tranche payments for the ARPA Recovery Fund**  
Effective April 4, 2022, the federal government switched service providers and stopped using the DUNS number and began using the Unique Entity ID (UEI) – All counties are required to switch from a DUNS number to a UEI

**Key Takeaways:**

- Treasury will send an email notification to counties 30 days before they can receive their second tranche payment
- The designated point of contact for the first tranche submission must log into the portal before the payment to update the county's information
- Counties need an active [SAM.gov](https://sam.gov) registration to receive their second tranche payment
- Treasury expects to provide second tranche payments to local governments approximately 12 months after their first payment



**Primary Election Voting Explained**

- **Thu. June 2:** Last day to submit an application for an absentee ballot
- **Sat. June 4:** Early voting ends in New Mexico
- **Tue. June 7:** Primary election day, polls across the state will be open from 7AM-7PM

There is one major change to the New Mexico elections this year. It is now possible to register to vote the same day you want to cast your vote, and to change your party affiliation to vote in the primary of a major party: Democrat, Republican, or Libertarian. This applies to declined-to-state or those registered with a minor party. Voters who utilize this option and who then wish to revert back to being DTS or registered with a minor party can update their registration online at [nmvote.org](https://nmvote.org) after voting. New Mexicans who are eligible to vote can register to vote or update their voter registration immediately before voting in a statewide election during early voting and on election day.

**NACo: OMB issues information on Single Audit Compliance Requirements for ARPA Recovery Funds and ERA Program**

The 2022 Compliance Supplement outlines information on how to conduct Single Audits for federal programs, including American Rescue Plan Act Fiscal Recovery Fund investments and the Emergency Rental Assistance Program. Federal law requires counties that invested \$750,000 or more in federal funds within its fiscal year to have an auditor conduct Single Audits of these expenditures.

**Key Takeaways:**

- Auditors must use Part 3 of the OMB Compliance Supplement and the Recovery Fund Program supplement to perform the audit
- Counties must comply with the Final Rule effective as of April 1, 2022
- Auditors must audit recipients on funds they expended FY 2022
- Treasury will not take action to enforce against uses of the Interim Final Rule if the use of funds is consistent with the terms of the Final Rule

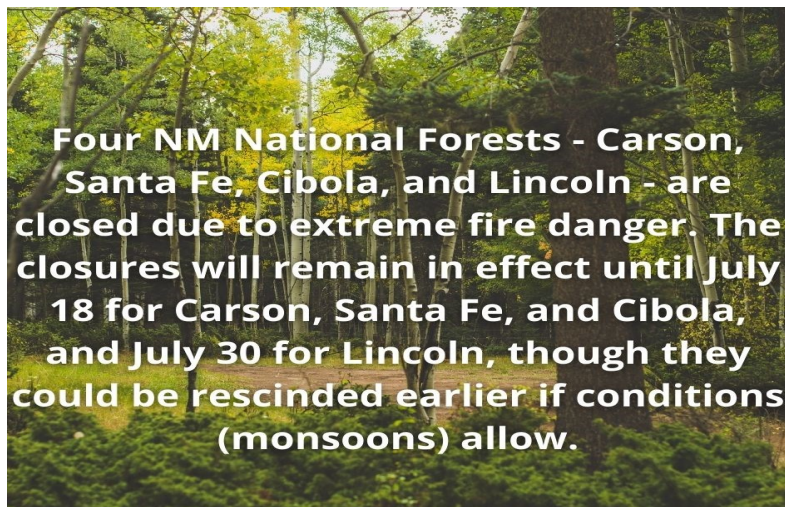
**Disaster Preparedness for Outdoor Recreation Businesses**
