NM counties ask for help in operating ~excerpt Albuquerque Journal

In light of "crisis levels of understaffing" at jails across the state, general counsel for the New Mexico Counties organization raised concerns that counties - which run detention facilities - are footing the majority of the costs without much assistance from city and sate governments. "Money's tight – a big portion of the county money is going to jails, a very small portion of municipal funds are going to jails – so there's the financial issue," said attorney Grace Philips, speaking before the Legislature's Courts, Corrections and Justice Committee on Wednesday. "But I would suggest to you – because I know this is a committee that cares about policy – that there's also policy implications. ... I think you need skin in the game for policy reasons and you need skin in the game, just because it's a resource that you're using."

Out of 26 jails statewide five had more than 50% vacancy rates among correctional officers, as of August. A recent analysis found about 28% of general funds from counties statewide are going toward detention facilities, Philips said, although smaller counties are putting a greater percentage toward the facilities. Of the \$282.5 million spent on running jails statewide in Fiscal Year 2022, 90% was from county governments.
