


Cerro Grande Fire, Los Alamos, NM May 2000 235 structures, 43k acres, \$1 billion price tag...

- Sign Up for Emergency Notifications...
 - ✓ By County
 - ✓ By City
 - Search for "Alerts" and "Notifications"
 - Examples include: Reverse 9-1-1; CodeRed; Nixle.com

> Not Foolproof !!!

- Create video with phone (photos work too)
 - \checkmark One room per video
 - \checkmark ~1 minute per room
- "There's an App for that..." (here are a few examples)
 - Sortly
 Memento
 Nest Egg
 MyStuff
 Database
- More detail is always better...



Learning to Live with Fire: <u>Proactive Step #4</u>



- Make list of essential supplies:
 - ✓ Insulin, Inhaler, EpiPen, Heart Medication, ...
 - ✓ Typically, not over-the-counter drugs
- > Take a picture of bottle (prescription number)
- > 7-Day Supply
- Essential medical devices
- ➢ Infant needs as well...

Learning to Live with Fire: <u>Proactive Step #5</u>

- **P**et Evacuation Plan
 - Pet carriers are critical!
 - Pet prescriptions (7-day supply)
 - Pet food (~3-5 day supply)
 - Pet supplies (vaccination records, collar, leash, ID, bowl, water,)
 - Pictures of pets...in case they get lost
 - ➢ More pets ∴ more planning required

Learning to Live with Fire: Proactive Step #7



- "Priceless"
 - ➢ Family heirlooms:

Jewelry; Timepieces; Furniture; Recipes (hand written); Letters/Diaries/Scrapbooks; Military memorabilia; China; Quilts; Books; Collections (coins, stamps, baseball cards, vinyl); Wedding gowns; Trunks and chests; Musical instruments; Embroidered linens, Firearms, Art, Seeds, Photo albums; Anything else you like...

- ➤ Take some time to identify and prioritize...
- Transportation considerations...

Learning to Live with Fire: Proactive Step #8



- Papers (Important Documents?)
 - ➢ Most documents can be replaced...
 - On-site storage
 - Organized Container (suitable for transportation)
 - ✓ Digitized / Electronic Files
 - ✓ "Fire-Proof" Safe/Cabinets = Fire-Resistant
 - Check Underwriters Laboratories (UL) time: $\frac{1}{2}$ 4 hours
 - Check UL class rating: 125, 150, 350
 - UL 125 4 hrs. = internal max. temp. max at 4 hrs.

Learning to Live with Fire: Proactive Step #8



- Papers (Important Documents?)
 - Safe Deposit Box (Pros and Cons)
 - Online/Cloud Storage:

Dropbox, Google Drive, Microsoft OneDrive, etc.

Property Records:

Vehicle Registration & Titles Mortgage statements, deeds & bills of sale Insurance policies (home, auto, personal)

Burial Instructions Health Insurance Policies
