#### **Current state of affairs for New Mexico**

In some counties connectivity has not improved for 20 years.

Maps are insufficient and lacking valid data about service locations and availability.

Internet service providers build the most profitable first and unincorporated areas linger

Public funding to build is once in a generation opportunity

#### **Counties can lead and control their broadband deployment efforts**

Dedicate a program manager (staff or contractor) Be lead convener, set the table and invite the right guests Look at your poles and ROW as an asset you can leverage Keep improving the maps Fast track permitting – eliminate regulatory creep, engage all public partners Remove barriers. Use "relaxations" if it is in the public's best interest Be in it for the long haul

#### Make Your County Broadband Ready!

- Develop an outreach and engagement strategy
- Target federal funding that is winnable
  - Federal: <u>https://internet4all.gov/programs</u>
  - State: <u>https://www.nmlegis.gov/Sessions/21%20Regular/final/SB0377.pdf</u> Section 17 on page 41
  - State: Connect NM Pilot \$124M (ARPA) last date to apply is 2/27 (just extended to late March or early April!)
- If counties engage properly, they can be a difference maker and attract federal and state funds for broadband improvements for their residents who are in need and desperate for assistance.
- Stay engaged with OBAE (Office of Broadband) / Attend monthly meetings of Connect NM Council
  - Ask OBAE about TAP Technical Assistance Program

- What Else Does Engagement Look Like?
  Host regional and county meetings (recruit help from OBAE)
  Support surveys and data gathering efforts done by others
  ID and include all stakeholders Multi Family Housing, Ranchers, Health Professionals, Schools, Anchor Institutions, ...and more
- Line up your letters of support

### **Be Ready for BEAD**

- Focus on areas of greatest need, aka "unserved" -- that's where the most funding will get awarded.
- Service providers and/or fiber builders are eligible entities, as are counties or municipalities.
- The state will submit a BEAD plan 12/2023 Eligible entities need to be ready to apply to the state for their projects.
- •NM stands to receive \$600M in BEAD funds

### Some strategies your county might consider:

Think about the problem this way?....

1) Last 10% - hardest to reach homes, due to remoteness/distance and/or terrain.

Example: a home (ranch?) is 5 miles down a private road - all by itself.
2) The other 90% -- which parts have higher density of "unserved" locations?
3) Divide that 90% area up into smaller areas within your county
4) Focus on areas of greatest need, aka "unserved" -- that's where the most funding will get awarded.

### Some strategies your county might consider:

Levels of engagement: (sustain it for next 5 years)

- Level 1 identify locations/ take-on mapping
  - Lists of locations to focus on (see new FCC mapping portal for data)
  - Reach out to incumbents Keep meeting with them
- Level 2 reach out to other vendors
- Level 3 if no vendor interest, use champions to help you with tasks such as RFP and funding application. Work with OBAE.


### Some strategies your county might consider:

- Consider partnering with another county/counties.
- Bigger projects are normally more attractive to vendors.

### FCC's New Broadband Mapping - new resource for you to get it right!


- Where we are / How we got here: Bad data!

Two Data Types: Locations & Availability




