## **NMC Advisory Council Meeting**

• Staff review the NMC legislative process and share the legislative initiative template with the Advisory Council.

### June

#### **NMC Annual Conference**

- Affiliates discuss and select legislative initiatives.
- Affiliates may want to visit with other affiliates for joint initiatives.
- Affiliates fill out the legislative initiative template and submit to a NMC legislative team representative on Thursday afternoon.
- Non-elected affiliates present their legislative initiatives to the Managers' Affiliate for endorsement on Friday morning, from 8:30 a.m. – 10:00 a.m. on June 16<sup>th</sup>.

# July

## **NMC Legislative Committee Meeting**

- Affiliate chairs present their legislative initiatives to the Legislative Committee.
- Legislative Committee reviews legislative initiatives and makes recommendations to the Board of Directors.

# August

## **NMC Board of Directors Meeting**

- NMC Board of Directors votes to endorse or deny affiliate initiatives.
- NMC Board of Directors selects NMC priorities.
- Endorsed initiatives are advanced by the affiliate; priority initiatives are advanced by NMC staff in coordination with the affiliate.

# July - December

## **NM Legislative Interim Committee Meetings**

 NMC legislative team presents county priorities to interim NM Legislative Committees, NMML, and other stakeholders.

#### November/December

# **NM Legislative Council Service**

- <u>Endorsed initiatives:</u> affiliates identify legislative sponsor(s) and drafts bills with help from Legislative Council Service.
- <u>Priority initiatives:</u> NMC legislative team identifies legislative sponsor(s) and drafts bills with help from Legislative Council Service.

#### January

# **Bill Introduction & Committee Assignments**

- <u>Endorsed initiatives:</u> affiliates pursue bill passage and present to NM legislative committees.
- <u>Priority initiatives:</u> NMC legislative team pursues bill passage and presents to NM legislative committees.
