



GOOD NEWS: State Covering Bill for First Responder Radio Service At the direction of Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham, the state will pay monthly subscriber fees for radio service for federal, local, and tribal first responders. The decision comes following the failure of a bill in the last legislative session that would have reimbursed public safety agencies for the cost of the subscription. The statewide system is managed and operated by the state DoIT. [Senate Bill 409](#), sponsored by Sens. Burt, McKenna, and Rep. Hernandez, would have reimbursed first responders from municipal, county, or tribal public safety agencies the subscriber fees for interoperability. The governor asked DoIT to cover the subscriber fee to honor her commitment to public safety. The state encourages more public safety agencies to utilize the system, which provides the ability for first responders from different agencies to communicate with each other in an emergency event on a unified platform. This was a NMC initiative.
