



Fuels Reduction Snapshot

- Ciudad SWCD and EMIFPA 27 acres thinning and 1,200 tons biomass removed
- San Pedro (Wildfire Network) 29 acres thinning and 200 tons biomass removed
- Socorro County, Bosquecito Phase 2 – 86 acres mastication and 71 acres chemical
- Taos County-Guadalupe East –
 13 acres thinning and 13 acres piled



Community Assistance/WUI Fire Mitigation

- Socorro- Wildhorse Slash pit an area where homeowners can place vegetation from their property and BLM fire management will burn when appropriate
- Pueblo De Cochiti community assistance funded fuels reduction work – funded for the next 3 years
- 18000+ acres of wildland urban interface thinning and prescribed burning adjacent to communities on BLM land throughout the Albuquerque District
